Today, August 19, 1971, we interviewed F.B.I. Agent William J. Crumley, who was on scene. Crumley gave us some details.

Officer Crowell was assigned with him on Lewis Street. They covered Northwest conner of 1148 Lewis. They were sheilded by house on conner of Ewing and Lewis. ApprOx. 6:37 A.M. Agent, James Sammons shouted over bull horn for occupants to come, out, as they had warrants for arrest. Sammons told them they had (1) one minute to come out. Sammons was in front of house.

Group gave occupants (75) seventy-five seconds and no one came out. At this time, Crumley fired a round of tear gas into house. Firing immediately started coming from inside house. Crumley heard someone scream that he was hit. Officer Crowell then fired (2) two shots from his shotgun. Crowell was then immediately wounded.

Crumley turned over to us a sketch of every one's position while at scene. This is attached to report.
