6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
9	Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Governor's
LO	Office - Division of Medicaid for the purpose of providing medical
L1	assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law and defraying the
L2	expenses of the administration of such law, as provided in Section
L3	43-13-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year
L 4	beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017
L5	\$ 885,512,790.00.
L 6	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L7	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
L8	to the credit of the Medical Care Fund created by Section
L 9	43-13-143, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of providing

20	medical assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law for the
21	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017
22	\$ 408,319,013.00.
23	SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
24	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
25	the State Treasury to the credit of the Governor's
26	Office - Division of Medicaid which is comprised of special source
27	funds collected by or otherwise available to the commission, for
28	the purpose of providing medical assistance under the Mississippi
29	Medicaid Law and defraying the expenses of the administration of
30	such law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending
31	June 30, 2017\$ 4,690,433,744.00.
32	Prior period recovery of funds may be maintained and expended
33	by the division when the recovery is received or finalized. Any
34	recoveries due to audits or third party recoveries may be used to

- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as

- 101 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 102 Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall maintain complete 103 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 104 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 105 106 Year 2016. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 107 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2018 shall be 108 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 109

Waiver Program for Home- and Community-Based Services.

SECTION 12. In the division's Fiscal Year 2018 budget submission, all Medicaid 1915 (C) Home- and Community-Based Waivers shall be presented as a budget program separate from the Medical Services Program.

SECTION 13. The Division shall transfer One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) of State Support Funds to the Department of Rehabilitation Services for the support of the Independent Living Home- and Community-Based Waiver program and shall transfer One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) of State Support Funds to the Department of Human Services to support the Home Delivered Meals program.

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244	SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
245	of this act, Two Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
246	(\$2,750,000.00) are provided for the purpose of funding a
247	temporary program to provide nonemergency transportation to
248	locations for necessary dialysis services for end-stage renal

299	SECTION 17. Of the funds appropriated herein, an amount not
300	to exceed Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) is provided
301	for payments to certain eligible obstetricians and gynecologists
302	for the provision of certain primary care services, as defined by
303	the division, at up to one hundred percent (100%) of the Medicare
304	Physician fee schedule.
305	SECTION 18. Of the funds appropriated herein, an amount not
306	to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) is provided to pay
307	eligible hospital providers according to a payment schedule
308	developed by the division, and outside of the APR-DRG
309	reimbursement methodology, for the insertion of long acting
310	reversible contraceptives (LARCs) at the time of delivery.
311	SECTION 19. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1, 2, 3
312	and 4, funds are provided for Phase One (1) and Phase Two (2) of
313	the Mississippi Delta Medicaid Population Health Demonstration
314	Project.
315	SECTION 20. The amount of funds appropriated from the State
316	General Fund in this bill are conditioned upon the availability
317	for appropriation of the full amount of the state general funds

318	that were projected in the general fund revenue estimate	for
319	fiscal year 2017 that was determined under the provision	of
320	Section 27-103-125.	

321 If the amount of general funds projected to be available for 322 appropriation for fiscal year 2017 would be reduced by the 323 enactment into law of any revenue bills, as defined in Joint Rule 324 40, that have been passed by the House of Representatives by March 325 17, 2016, then the amount of funds appropriated from the State 326 General Fund in this bill shall be reduced by the same percentage 327 reduction in the amount of general funds that would be available for appropriation for fiscal year 2017, and the reduced amount 328 329 shall be engrossed into this bill before it is transmitted to 330 Senate.

The determination of whether the House has passed any such revenue bills by March 17, 2016, and the amount and percentage of the resulting reduction in the amount of general funds projected to be available for appropriation for fiscal year 2017, shall be determined by the Legislative Budget Office and certified in writing to the Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee by the Director of the Legislative Budget Office.

SECTION 21. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
